Colonoscopies per doctor in one year = 562

A higher number is better. Our doctors far exceed the minimum recommended number.

Screening Colonoscopy

| • Number Performed | 8,448 | 6,935 |
| • Average withdrawal time (minutes) | 11.6 | 12.0 |
| • Adenoma detection rate | 28% | 35.9% |
| • Cecum attainment rate | 97.5% | 99.4% |
- Average withdrawal time
 - A higher number is better as it indicates that our doctors take their time to perform a good exam. National Benchmark: Greater than 6 minutes
 - Adenoma detection rate
 - A higher number is better, indicating that our doctors find more precancerous polyps. National Benchmark: 25% for men, 15% for women.
 - Cecum attainment rate
 - A higher number is better as it indicates a complete colon exam. National Benchmark: >95%

Complication Rates

• Upper endoscopy

Bleeding after removal of a polyp. Expressed per 1000 procedures performed. A smaller number is better.

National Benchmark: 10/1000

Bowel Perforation: Expressed per 1000 procedures performed. A smaller number is better.

National Benchmark: 1/1000

Both of these numbers show that the safety record of our doctors far exceed the benchmarks.
